Fire Department-Report Included

He stated that it may not always be a large increase for Redfield, but there will be increases to Act 833.

Park Commission-Report Included

Planning Commission

Mayor Carter led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.



He spoke to an official from the State Aid Program and he said ours is on top of the list to be awarded, but there is no guarantee yet.
- He also reported that the Highway Department will be redoing Highway 365 from Pulaski County Line to White Hall.

Water Department – Report Included.

- Water Superintendent Chris Liles was absent.
- Council Member Darrell Hedden asked Mayor Harmon Carter about the meeting between the Department of Health and the Water Department concerning an old issue that could result in the Water Department losing the right to issue meters in the City. Mayor Carter stated that during the meeting our Water Engineer Aaron Benzing said he would be able to handle the issue and work with the developer's engineer to get the issue resolved. He also added that the suspension of water meters for the city would be a "worst case scenario" from the Department of Health and he believed it would not come to pass.

New Business



- Chief Danny Akines reported that the county will longer repair emergency sirens and that all future repairs needed for the 2 in city limits will have to be maintained by the city.

Park Commission-Report Included

- Park Commissioner Diann Smith reported the RAA requested to extend the user agreement till the end of July. Park Commission voted to extend.
- The RAA will also be using the concession stand during the 4th of July activities at the park.
- They have gotten 2 quotes for security cameras: \$3,175 & \$3,023. No action was taken.

- She stated that they have a letter of support and a petition from citizens to turn in for the \$25,000 non-matching grant for the dog park at the Dollarway Park.

- Mr. Ferguson stated that Sunset West was approved over a year ago, but during the utility review, changes were made and had to be reviewed again. Because of the changes made, no action was taken and Mr. Ferguson has been trying to contact the developments engineer.

He stated that there will now be 2 officers at the high school along with a gun detecting dog and that all elementary schools will have an officer on site, whether it be an SRO or an off duty officer.

Street Department-Report Included

- Street Superintendent James Smith reported that while the bridge was closed the last 2 days, they were able to place the new culvert and repair the road afterwards.

Council Member Sandra Garrett made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Council Member Darrell Hedden and passed unanimously.
