## CITY COUNCIL MEETING

January 8, 2018

Mayor Roben Brooks called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Daniel Travis led the group in prayer.

Mayor Brooks led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Council Members Darrell Hedden, Allison Beasley, Daniel Travis, Sandra Garrett, Carol Eagle, and Elizabeth Milam.

Council Member Elizabeth Milam made the motion to accept the December City Council Minutes with a correction in the park section, which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett and passed unanimously.

Council Member Sandra Garrett made the motion to accept the December Financial Report, which was seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle and passed unanimously.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS** – all Committee Reports will be included in the minutes

**Mayor Roben Brooks asked to change the order of the committee reports.**

### **Fire Department-Report Included**

- Chief Danny Akines was absent but it was reported that Rich DeBill was awarded Jefferson County Volunteer Firefighter of the Year for 2018.

### **Police Department – Report Included.**

- Police Chief Steve McFatrige reported that K9 Officer Rich DeBill and Boston completed their training and Officer Debill would be attending Police Academy in March.

- He also reported that there were no B&E's reported for the month of November or December.

### **Street Department-Report Included**

- Street Superintendent James Smith reported that we will know if we have received a grant for Red Oak Acres from the State Aid Program when they meet on January 16<sup>th</sup>.
- He also discussed selling the Grasshopper Mower. Council Member Sandra Garrett made a motion to post it for sale with a minimum bid of \$1,000 by closed bids that should be turned in to City Hall on February 11 which was seconded by Council Member Daniel Travis and passed unanimously.

### **Animal Control**

- Mike Shinn reported there were 10 dogs on site at the end of the month.

### **Water Department – Report Included.**

- Water Superintendent Perry Veazey stated that they had a sewer pump that needed replaced and asked the Council for permission to purchase a new one. Council Member Sandra Garrett made a motion to purchase the pump seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle and passed unanimously.
- Aaron Benzing from Hawkins-Weir stated that the health department did not find any significant items for improvement to the new water treatment plant (WTP) and gave the city approval to put the system online and produce water.
- Aaron Benzing from Hawkins-Weir and Dwight Witcher from EPS discussed with council the potential liquidated damages due to the WTP exceeding the contract time limit for completion.
  - Mr. Benzing stated that per the contract, the city could charge EPS \$500 per calendar day that the project is not complete. The job is still not complete and damages are currently \$31,000.
  - Mr. Witcher stated that the project was very challenging. He cited sub-contractor problems and poor weather for many of the delays.
  - Council Member Darrell Hedden stated that he believed that some of the delays were caused by the city and made a motion to decrease the number of days by 21 days (\$10,500) which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett. After further discussion the motion failed with 6 votes against.
  - Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion for Hawkins-Weir to not access liquidated damages until the next city council meeting which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett and passed unanimously.

### **Park Commission-Report Included**

- Park Commissioner Diann Smith stated that Mary Ann Seal has been added as a new member of the Park Commission.

- She also stated that there is a huge sink hole on the Babe Ruth Field that is in need of repair. One estimate of \$25k has already been received and they will be getting more estimates.

### **Planning Commission**

- James Smith reported that conditional approval was given on the Sunset Valley West PUD plat and that they approved a re-plat in Sunset Valley Phase IV because a house was built too far into a right a way. Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion to approve this action taken by the Planning Commission which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett and passed unanimously.
- He also reported that Park Lakes Phase 2 was approved. Council Member Daniel Travis made a motion to approve Park Lakes Phase 2 which was seconded by Carol Eagle and passed 5 for and Council Member Darrell Hedden voting "here".
- Mr. Smith stated that the next Planning Commission meeting would be on January 24th to discuss a drainage study for the Sunset Valley West PUD.
- It was also reported that John Seal would be added as a Planning Commission member.

### **Old Business**

- Mayor Roben Brooks stated that she was not comfortable passing the budget in its current form at this time. Council Member Carol Eagle made a motion to have a special city council meeting on January 29<sup>th</sup> to address the 2019 Budget which was seconded by Council Member Elizabeth Milam and passed unanimously.

### **New Business**

- Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion to pay no more invoices owed to GarNat Engineers until Vernon Williams comes before council to address concerns which was seconded by Council Member Allison Beasley and failed. 2 for, 4 against.
- Council Member Sandra Garrett made a motion for Mayor Roben Brooks, Recorder/Treasurer Dane Fults, and Council Member Darrel Hedden to be the check signers for the city which was seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle and passed unanimously.

Council Member Sandra Garrett made the motion to pay invoices, seconded by Council Member Elizabeth Milam and passed unanimously.

Council Member Carol Eagle made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett and passed 5 for, 1 against.

Mayor Roben Brooks, Recorder/Treasurer Dane Fults, City Council, and City Department Heads discussed the 2019 Budget.



### **Fire Department-Report Included**

- Chief Danny Akines reported that they did not receive a grant to get a Turnout washer. He stated that the washer would still be purchased, but from Act 833 Funds.

### **Park Commission-Report Included**

- Park Commissioner Diann Smith reported that they had a special meeting last night to discuss fixing the Babe Ruth infield. She stated that they have received quotes and asked for council's approval to spend \$17,150 from Park Savings to do the repairs. Council Member Allison Beasley made a

motion to approve the spending which was seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle and passed 3 for, 1 against, and 1 abstain.

- Ramona Donatelli and Brian Krause from the Redfield Athletic Association spoke to council about their current basketball season and some future goals with baseball and flag football.

### **Planning Commission**

- James Smith Reported that McClelland Engineering have reviewed the drainage issues on the Sunset Valley West PUD. He stated that most issues were being resolved and that a retention pond needs approval from ARDOT.
- He stated that they approved a setback variance on Huck Finn.
- He also recommended that zoning fees be changed.

### **Code Enforcement**

- Code Enforcer Nathan Travis reported that there were numerous new constructions around town in various stages.
- Council Member Elizabeth Milam made a motion to add Mayor Roben Brooks to the Nuisance Committee replacing former Mayor Carter which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett and passed unanimously.

### **Police Department – Report Included.**

- Police Chief Steve McFatrige reported that K9 Officer Rich DeBill would start Academy on March 3<sup>rd</sup> for 13 weeks.

### **Animal Control**

- Mike Shinn reported there was only 1 dog on site at the end of the month and 59 hours worked for animal control.

### **Street Department-Report Included**

- Street Superintendent James Smith reported that the Red Oak Acres project should begin in spring.

### **Water Department – Report Included.**

- Aaron Benzing from Hawkins-Weir reported that progress at the new water treatment plant (WTP) had not gotten any faster. He stated that liquidated damages would be at \$54,000 by March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Mr. Benzing also addressed the lien that has been placed on the WTP by a subcontractor working on the job. He assured council that the matter was between the contractor and subcontractor and would not affect the city.
- Water Superintendent Perry Veazey reported that the new pump had been installed at Park Side and was fully operational.

### **Old Business**

- Roben Brooks reported that there was only 1 bid received for the Grasshopper mower thus far. Bids will be opened February 11th

- Mrs. Smith also reported that a bulletin board/message center will be purchased for the park at a cost of \$499.
- Street Superintendent James Smith and Park Commissioner Diann Smith reported on the work started on the Babe Ruth field project.

### **Planning Commission**

- James Smith reported that Mayor Roben Brooks has sworn in the new planning commission members.
- Counselor Margaret Dobson stated that adjustments to the subdivision fees would be addressed at the next meeting.
- Council Member Darrell Hedden voiced his concern about Senate Bill 170 and how it would affect the city planning commission.

### **Code Enforcement**

- Code Enforcer Nathan Travis reported that there were numerous new constructions around town in various stages.
- He also reported that he is currently working on an Electrical Permit Ordinance.
- Mayor Roben Brooks stated that Building Code Enforcer Nathan Travis and Street Superintendent James Smith would be attending a Code Enforcement Workshop this month.

### **Police Department – Report Included.**

- Lieutenant Jason Anzaldua reported that Officer Rich DeBill has started Academy at Camp Robinson.
- He also reported that Police Chief Steve McFatrige broke his arm. He stated while Police Chief Steve McFatrige is off and Officer Debill is at Academy, officers that are working at White Hall schools during the day will cover open shifts in Redfield instead.

### **Animal Control**

- Mike Shinn reported there were 3 dogs on site at the end of the month.
- He also stated that there were 37.5 hours worked on Animal Control.

### **Street Department-Report Included**

- Street Superintendent James Smith reported that ARDOT let the bid for the Red Oak Acres project at \$288,000. He stated that the grant we received will be for \$250,000 and the remaining \$38,000 will be up to the city to cover. Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion to pay the \$38,000 from General Fund Savings which was seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle. The motion passed unanimously.
- Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion to hire Built-Rite Fence Co. to put up fencing at the dog kennels which was seconded by Council Member Daniel Travis. The motion passed unanimously.
- The city only received 1 bid for the Grasshopper Mower from James Smith for \$1,100.

- Street Superintendent James Smith stated that the Redfield Spring Cleanup Days will be March 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

### **Water Department – Report Included.**

- Water Superintendent Perry Veazey requested approval to have Hawkins-Weir Engineering do a study of the wastewater treatment facility. Council Member Sandra Garrett made a motion to do the study which was seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle. The motion passed unanimously.
- Water Superintendent Perry Veazey reported that they have run into some issues at the new water treatment plant, but the engineers and contractors are working to get the problem fixed.
- Mayor Roben Brooks reported that per her last conversation with Aaron Benzing from Hawkins-Weir, liquidated damages for the new water treatment plant are estimated to be \$57,000 by the end of the month.

### **Old Business**

- Mayor Roben Brooks reported that they will be meeting soon to discuss the Nuisance Ordinance.
- Counselor Margaret Dobson reported that she sent her yearly report out to Mayor Roben Brooks, Recorder Treasurer Dane Fults, and city council.

### **New Business**

- Counselor Margaret Dobson read Ordinance 2019-01. Council Member Darrell Hedden made a motion to accept the 1<sup>st</sup> reading which was seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett. Council Member Carol Eagle made the motion to pay invoices, seconded by Council Member Sandra Garrett. The motion passed unanimously.



**New Business**



Council Member Darrell Hedden made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Council Member Carol Eagle. The motion passed unanimously.


